## FFT Danger Tree Assessment and Falling Standard

## 1.0 WILDLIFE AND DANGER TREES

- 1.1 For level 1 disturbance, a recipient must have a qualified *Wildlife/Danger Tree Assessor* assess trees within the work area as
  - a. Wildlife trees
  - b. Danger trees
  - c. Wildlife trees that are also Danger trees.
- 1.2 For all other levels (levels greater than level 1 disturbance), a recipient must have a certified *Wildlife/Danger Tree Assessor* assess trees within the work area as
  - a. Wildlife trees
  - b. Danger trees
  - c. Wildlife trees that are also Danger trees.
- 1.3 All Trees that are assessed as danger trees must be felled in accordance with the Workers' Compensation Act Regulations.
  - a. Danger trees that the faller is unable to fell must be marked with the appropriate no-treatment zones.
    - i. Marking must be done with paint and unique ribbon
- 1.4 Wildlife trees that are also Danger trees be must be marked with the appropriate no-treatment zones.
  - a. Marking must be done with paint and unique ribbon
- 1.5 The recipient must assure that the non-work zones are adequately marked when workers are in the area
