### 6.6.2 Miscellaneous Stumpage Rates for Timber Licences

The stumpage rates in Table 6-2 apply only to timber licence cutting authority areas that are not appraised and have a cutting authority term that began before May 1, 1995.

For each species of timber in column 1 of Table 6-2, the stumpage rate immediately opposite that species in columns 2, 3 and 4 respectively, apply to sawlogs scaled in the indicated forest regions on and after April 1, 1998.
