Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	There are 33 personnel and numerous skimmers working to suppress this estimated 577 hectare wildfire today. This fire is classified as out of control as no further spread can't be guaranteed. There has not been any growth towards Kelowna.
Weather forecast	Today: Mainly sunny MAX TEMP: 28° to 32° MIN RH: 15% to 30% WINDS: NE-NW 10-20 km/h and NW 20-30 G 45 km/h near Kelowna and Peachland CHANCE OF LIGHTNING or DRY LIGHTNING is low
Fire behaviour prediction	Potential for increased fire behaviour in all fuel types compared to yesterday if the winds materialize. Expect fire spread to be slope driven unless terrain is less than 30% slope. If winds are as strong as forecast then fire can spread across slope now. Fire spread caused by winds will generally be in a southerly direction. The Garnet valley is currently getting lighter winds than those that occur in the main Okanagan valley. This is expected to continue. RH's will be +/- 10% higher in the Garnet valley.
Challenges	Steep, rocky terrain
Yesterday's achievements	Crews were able to establish hose lay and hand guard on the northeast flank. Good progress was made yesterday and this fire continues to respond well to suppression tactics. (Hose lay is an arrangement of connected lengths of fire hose and accessories on the ground, beginning at the first pumping unit and ending at the point of water delivery)
Today's objectives	Crews will focus their attention to the southeast flank of this wildfire today by building guard and establishing water delivery.
