Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	118 hectares in size (estimated) 43 personnel on site (20 BCWS and 23 contract). Air support, as required. 9 helicopters are assigned to the complex. This wildfire is classified as being held
Weather forecast	Today: Mainly sunny MAX TEMP: 28° to 32° MIN RH: 15% to 30% WINDS: NE-NW 10-20 km/h and NW 20-30 G 45 km/h near Kelowna and Peachland CHANCE OF LIGHTNING or DRY LIGHTNING: low
Fire behaviour prediction	Potential for increased fire behaviour in all fuel types compared to yesterday if the winds materialize. Expect fire spread to be slope driven unless terrain is less than 30% slope. If winds are as strong as forecast then fire can spread across slope now. Fire spread caused by winds will generally be in a southerly direction.
Challenges	There are many fingers to this wildfire, which makes extinguishing the hot spots a time consuming task. Fire fingers are the long narrow extensions of a fire projecting from the main body.
Yesterday's achievements	Crews had an effective day on the southern end by extinguishing hot spots 100 feet in. Good progress was made.
Today's objectives	Today, ground crews are continuing to work towards the centre by extinguishing hot spots.
<p>Out of Control: Describes a wildfire that is not responding (or only responding on a limited basis) to suppression action, such that the perimeter spread is not being contained.</p> <p>Being Held: indicated that (with the resources currently committed to the fire) sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing or predetermined boundaries under the prevailing and forecasted conditions.</p> <p>Under Control: The fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread of the fire.</p> <p>Out: The fire has been extinguished.</p>
