Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	1793 hectares in size (estimated) 82 personnel on site (62 BCWS and 20 contract). Air support, as required. 9 helicopters are assigned to the complex. This wildfire is classified as being held
Weather forecast	Today: Mainly sunny MAX TEMP: 29° to 34° MIN RH: 15% to 25% WINDS: N-NW 10-20 km/h CHANCE OF LIGHTNING / DRY LIGHTNING Low Poor overnight recoveries 40-60%
Fire behaviour prediction	Anticipate very similar fire behaviour compared to yesterday. Expect fire spread to be slope driven unless terrain is less than 30% slope. Fire spread <u>caused by winds</u> will generally be in a southerly direction. The Garnet valley is currently getting lighter winds than those that occur in the main Okanagan valley. This is expected to continue
Challenges	The challenges experienced on this fire by ground crews are mainly due to the patches of unburned fuel that remain within the perimeter of the fire. Furthermore, the wind and slope that this fire presented, definitely add to the difficulty.
Yesterday's achievements	Crews extinguished hot spots 100 feet in from the edge and have established a wet line. A wet line is a line of water, or water and retardant, sprayed along the ground which serves as a temporary control line.
Today's objectives	Today, ground crews are focusing their efforts on extinguishing hot spots in the green islands that are in the black. Crews will also start to transition into patrol status to confirm that all hot spots have been extinguished.
<p>Out of Control: Describes a wildfire that is not responding (or only responding on a limited basis) to suppression action, such that the perimeter spread is not being contained.</p> <p>Being Held: indicated that (with the resources currently committed to the fire) sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing or predetermined boundaries under the prevailing and forecasted conditions.</p> <p>Under Control: The fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread of the fire.</p> <p>Out: The fire has been extinguished.</p>
