Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	577 hectares in size (estimated) There are 63 personnel (49 BCWS and 14 contract). 9 helicopters are assigned to the complex. This fire is classified as out of control as no further spread can't be guaranteed.
Weather forecast	Today: Mainly sunny MAX TEMP: 29° to 34° MIN RH: 15% to 25% WINDS: N-NW 10-20 km/h CHANCE OF LIGHTNING / DRY LIGHTNING: low Poor overnight recoveries 40-60%
Fire behaviour prediction	Anticipate very similar fire behaviour compared to yesterday. Expect fire spread to be slope driven unless terrain is less than 30% slope. Fire spread <u>caused by winds</u> will generally be in a southerly direction. The Garnet valley is currently getting lighter winds than those that occur in the main Okanagan valley. This is expected to continue
Challenges	The fingers of this wildfire are still presenting challenges as they make suppression a time consuming task. Fingers are the long narrow extensions of a fire projecting from the main body. This wildfire brings tough working conditions for crews as it is in extremely steep, rocky terrain with no shade and direct sun exposure.
Yesterday's achievements	Yesterday, crews focused their attention on the north flank to increase containment and extinguish hot spots.
Today's objectives	Today, the main goal is for ground crews to work on the east side of this wildfire for further containment within this area.
<p>Out of Control: Describes a wildfire that is not responding (or only responding on a limited basis) to suppression action, such that the perimeter spread is not being contained.</p> <p>Being Held: indicated that (with the resources currently committed to the fire) sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing or predetermined boundaries under the prevailing and forecasted conditions.</p> <p>Under Control: The fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread of the fire.</p> <p>Out: The fire has been extinguished.</p>
