Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	15.5 hectares in size (estimated) 30 personnel on site (10 BCWS and 20 contract). Air support, as required. 9 helicopters are assigned to the complex. This wildfire is classified as under control
Weather forecast	Today: Mainly sunny MAX TEMP: 29° to 34° MIN RH: 15% to 25% WINDS: N-NW 10-20 km/h CHANCE OF LIGHTNING / DRY LIGHTNING low Poor overnight recoveries 40-60%
Fire behaviour prediction	Anticipate very similar fire behaviour compared to yesterday. Expect fire spread to be slope driven unless terrain is less than 30% slope. Fire spread <u>caused by winds</u> will generally be in a southerly direction. The Garnet valley is currently getting lighter winds than those that occur in the main Okanagan valley. This is expected to continue.
Challenges	This fire proved to be challenging with how deep it burned. Crews had to keep this in mind and be diligent with their suppression efforts, making sure hot spots were fully extinguished before moving to the next one.
Yesterday's achievements	This wildfire has many of its hot spots extinguished and continues to be blacklined. Blacklining refers to fuels that have burned, either naturally or through planned ignitions. Planned ignitions are a wildfire suppression technique based on the concept of blackline as a barrier to fire spread.
Today's objectives	Today's objectives include extinguishing the hot spots on this wildfire and doing patrol to make sure there isn't any remaining.
<p>Out of Control: Describes a wildfire that is not responding (or only responding on a limited basis) to suppression action, such that the perimeter spread is not being contained.</p> <p>Being Held: indicated that (with the resources currently committed to the fire ) sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing or predetermined boundaries under the prevailing and forecasted conditions.</p> <p>Under Control: The fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread of the fire.</p> <p>Out: The fire has been extinguished.</p>
