Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	32 hectares in size (estimated). 44 personnel on site today. Air support, as required. 6 helicopters are assigned to the complex. This wildfire is classified as out of control
Weather forecast	Today we will see mainly sunny skies with lingering smoke. There is a 30% chance of lightning and 20% chance of dry lightning. Northwesterly winds gusting at 20 are predicted to reach 40 km/h by this afternoon.
Fire behaviour prediction	Fires located on the east side may see slightly stronger winds today due to exposure. Expect fire spread to be slope driven (unless terrain is less than 30% slope). If fire spread is a result of wind, it will generally be in a southerly direction.
Challenges	Ground crews have had challenges with the extreme heat they face daily and the lack of shade on this particular wildfire. The importance of hydration has been emphasized to crews.
Yesterday's achievements	The weather worked in our favour, in terms of progress, by bringing in an inversion. This kept winds and fire activity calm, allowing ground crews to advance up their lines.
Today's objectives	Crews will continue to work from the southeast corner to the north, finding heat and extinguishing these hot spots along the way. A heat scan is being scheduled in order to find further hot spots.
<p>Out of Control: Describes a wildfire that is not responding (or only responding on a limited basis) to suppression action, such that the perimeter spread is not being contained.</p> <p>Being Held: indicated that (with the resources currently committed to the fire) sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing or predetermined boundaries under the prevailing and forecasted conditions.</p> <p>Under Control: The fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread of the fire.</p> <p>Out: The fire has been extinguished.</p>
