Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	1793 hectares in size (estimated) 87 personnel and 4 pieces of heavy equipment are on site today. There are ground crews on night operations for this wildfire as well. Air support, as required. 6 helicopters are assigned to the complex. This wildfire is classified as being held
Weather forecast	Today we will see mainly sunny skies with lingering smoke. There is a 30% chance of lightning and 20% chance of dry lightning. Northwesterly winds gusting at 20 are predicted to reach 40 km/h by this afternoon.
Fire behaviour prediction	Fires located on the east side may see slightly stronger winds today due to exposure. Expect fire spread to be slope driven (unless terrain is less than 30% slope). If fire spread is a result of wind, it will generally be in a southerly direction.
Challenges	The challenges experienced on this fire by crews are mainly due to the patches of unburned fuel that remain within the perimeter of the fire. Additionally, the steep slopes of this wildfire increase difficulty for ground crews.
Yesterday's achievements	Yesterday, ground crews implemented a patrol on the north flank in order to mop-up (mop-up means that crews are extinguishing any heat that they find).
Today's objectives	Today's objectives patrolling the area in order to extinguish any spots found. A heat scan is being scheduled in order to find further hot spots.
<p>Out of Control: Describes a wildfire that is not responding (or only responding on a limited basis) to suppression action, such that the perimeter spread is not being contained.</p> <p>Being Held: indicated that (with the resources currently committed to the fire) sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing or predetermined boundaries under the prevailing and forecasted conditions.</p> <p>Under Control: The fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread of the fire.</p> <p>Out: The fire has been extinguished.</p>
