Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	1793 hectares in size (estimated). 87 personnel and 2 pieces of heavy equipment are on site today. There are ground crews on night operations for this wildfire as well. Air support, as required. 6 helicopters are assigned to the complex. Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure contractors will be danger tree assessing and falling along the Hwy 97 corridor between Peachland and Summerland. This wildfire is classified as under control.
Weather forecast	Today we will see mainly sunny skies with temperatures ranging between 30 to 36 degrees. There will be lingering smoke in the area and a chance of isolated thunderstorms and dry lightning. Northwesterly winds will reach 40 km/h near Kelowna and are expected to switch to a southerly direction by the afternoon.
Fire behaviour prediction	Anticipate very similar fire behaviour potential compared to yesterday. Expect fire spread to be slope driven unless terrain is less than 30% slope. Fire spread caused by winds will generally be in a southerly direction. RH's in the Garnet Valley are starting to close the gap with other areas.
Challenges	The extreme temperatures and tough terrain that crews are subjected to continue to add a degree of great difficulty. With the sustained heat, some green patches are drying out and re-igniting which is putting up lots of smoke. This is completely contained and within the blackline. Crews are aware and monitoring.
Yesterday's achievements	A heat scan took place yesterday and crews were able to detect any remaining heat as a result. Crews also did a thorough patrol 200 feet into the perimeter of this wildfire.
Today's objectives	A heat scan took place on a portion of the fire yesterday. Crews were able to mop up any remaining heat in those areas. The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure contractors will continue to do danger tree assessing and falling along the Hwy 97 corridor between Peachland and Summerland.
<p>Out of Control: Describes a wildfire that is not responding (or only responding on a limited basis) to suppression action, such that the perimeter spread is not being contained.</p> <p>Being Held: indicated that (with the resources currently committed to the fire) sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing or predetermined boundaries under the prevailing and forecasted conditions.</p> <p>Under Control: The fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread of the fire.</p> <p>Out: The fire has been extinguished.</p>
