Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	Currently estimated at 1370 hectares in size. There are 54 personnel on site. 6 helicopters are assigned to the complex. This fire is classified as <u>out of control</u> .
Weather forecast	Today we will see mainly sunny skies with temperatures ranging between 30 to 36 degrees. There will be lingering smoke in the area and a chance of isolated thunderstorms and dry lightning. Northwesterly winds will reach 40 km/h near Kelowna and are expected to switch to a southerly direction by the afternoon.
Fire behaviour prediction	Anticipate very similar fire behaviour potential compared to yesterday. Expect fire spread to be slope driven unless terrain is less than 30% slope. Fire spread caused by winds will generally be in a southerly direction. Smoke will begin to drift north towards Kelowna.
Challenges	Ground crews continue to work in 30+ degree heat with little to no shade in extreme terrain. Yesterday was the hottest day on the fire for crews.
Yesterday's achievements	Crews continued to work containment lines on the southern end of this fire from Okanagan Lake. Hot spots were extinguished on the north flank inside the perimeter.
Today's objectives	Crews will continue to work on the south flank by extinguishing any heat they find while patrolling. This patrol will extend 100 feet into the fire's perimeter. Another patrol will take place on the north end from Okanagan Lake to end of hose lay, extinguishing hot spots along the way. The north flank will begin to undergo a demobilization of fire equipment.
<p>Out of Control: Describes a wildfire that is not responding (or only responding on a limited basis) to suppression action, such that the perimeter spread is not being contained.</p> <p>Being Held: indicated that (with the resources currently committed to the fire) sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing or predetermined boundaries under the prevailing and forecasted conditions.</p> <p>Under Control: The fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread of the fire.</p> <p>Out: The fire has been extinguished.</p>
