Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	Currently estimated at 1370 hectares in size. There are 53 personnel on site today. 6 helicopters are assigned to the complex. This fire is classified as out of control.
Weather forecast	A strong upper ridge will continue to provide hot and sunny conditions. With this air mass becoming slightly more unstable, there is a 20% risk of an afternoon thunderstorm. Temperatures will be around mid 30's today, and southerly winds will gust up to 40 km/h near Kelowna and 10-20 km/h elsewhere.
Fire behaviour prediction	Winds will remain light and temperature will start to decrease. With the forecast of instability, be prepared for some gusty conditions.
Challenges	Ground crews continue to work in extreme temperatures with no shade. The terrain is proving to add an element of difficulty as it's very steep and rocky.
Yesterday's achievements	Ground crews connected hose lay around the eastern edge. The northern flank has been patrolled, demobilized of fire equipment, and rehabbed. Rehabilitation occurs after a wildfire in order to restore the landscape back to its natural state to the best of our ability after suppression operations have been carried out.
Today's objectives	Today's objectives consist of patrolling and extinguishing any hot spots that are found.
Other	The Okanagan Complex wildfires will be transitioning to a new incident management team. New contact information for the new fire information phone will be posted on the BC Wildfire Service wildfires of note page once the changeover happens.
<p>Out of Control: Describes a wildfire that is not responding (or only responding on a limited basis) to suppression action, such that the perimeter spread is not being contained.</p> <p>Being Held: indicated that (with the resources currently committed to the fire) sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing or predetermined boundaries under the prevailing and forecasted conditions.</p> <p>Under Control: The fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread of the fire.</p> <p>Out: The fire has been extinguished.</p>
