Fire camp	Okanagan Complex Fire Camp
Incident overview	Currently estimated at 1370 hectares in size. There are 10 fire fighters on site today. 5 helicopters are assigned to the Okanagan Complex and are available to this wildfire if needed This fire is classified as under control .
Weather forecast	Today variable clouds are expected with a chance of isolated thunderstorms occurring this afternoon. Also, there is a chance of dry lightning. Temperatures today are expected to reach 26 to 30°C with southwest-northwest winds from 15 to 25km/h with possible gusts up to 40km/hr. A warmer drier trend will begin on Sunday under the influence of an upper ridge that will persist through Monday and Tuesday. Temperatures will rise each day and are expected to reach the low to mid-thirties. Winds will generally be light.
Fire behaviour prediction	There will be little potential for fire spread today. Fires will continue to burn deep underground and require diligent mop-up (extinguishment).
Challenges	The decreased temperatures have aided the fire fighters in their suppression efforts.
Yesterday's achievements	The crews demobilized additional gear in areas where it isn't needed. They also patrolled the east side of the fire to ensure there weren't any remaining hotspots. The crews established a 100 foot blackline on west side around a previous excursion.
Today's objectives	Ground crews will continue to patrol today and extinguish hotspots. Gear continues to be demobilized in areas where it is no longer required. Scanning is planned for the southeast boundary to determine if there are any remaining hotspots that need to be extinguished in this area.
Other	Smoke will be visible in some locations from within the interior of the fire perimeter. The sources of the smoke may be root systems, stumps, and/or deep organic material. These areas do not pose a threat of fire spread outside the current fire perimeter.
Wildfire Status Definitions	
Out of Control: Describes a wildfire that is not responding (or only responding on a limited basis) to suppression action, such that the perimeter spread is not being contained.	
Being Held: indicated that (with the resources currently committed to the fire) sufficient suppression action has been taken that the fire is not likely to spread beyond existing or predetermined boundaries under the prevailing and forecasted conditions.	
Under Control: The fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread of the fire.	
Out: The fire has been extinguished.
