

DISTRICT MANAGER INFORMATION NOTICE

RESOURCE ROAD RADIO CHANNEL RE-ASSIGNMENT

This letter is to notify all road users about changes to three existing Resource Road Radio (RR) channels in the Chilliwack Natural Resource District that have been re-assigned due to unforeseen cross channel interference.

The current RR-channel for Mystery Creek FSR (RR-4) has been re-assigned to avoid potential road safety hazards due to changes to road directionality and radio signal interference with the Chehalis-Statlu RR – channel (RR-4). A new polygon has been created for Mystery FSR, including all Mystery FSR branches, and a new RR channel has been assigned to this polygon.

- **The new assigned RR-channel for Mystery is RR-8.** *Chehalis-Statlu RR – channel remains the same (RR-4) as per the original channel assigned to this area.*

The current RR-channel for the Mount Woodside polygon (RR-28) has been re-assigned due to signal interference with the Big Silver polygon, also running on (RR-28).

- **The new assigned RR-channel for Mount Woodside is RR-1.**

The effective dates for switching to the re-assigned RR channels for Mystery and Mount Woodside FSR's is July 17, 2017.

The other area in question is Harrison East FSR. Due to the inclusion of Shovel Creek FSR in the Harrison East FSR polygon, a potential radio interference with a pre-existing licenced station at Port Douglas was identified by ISED (Industry, Science and Economic Development Canada) and a RR channel re-assignment was recommended to the new Harrison East FSR polygon.

Effective January 15, 2018, all traffic on the Harrison East FSR will switch from the current (RR-19) to the new channel (RR -18).

Attached to this notification, you will find a copy of the most updated Resource Road Radio Channel Overview Map for the Chilliwack Natural Resource District and a link to our Resource Road Radio Channel website where you will find additional information pertaining to these changes.

It is highly recommended to share this information with other parties that may be impacted by these changes.
