ADDENDA

Recommend that no action be taken by Parks Division to develop either area.

The only possible park development on Cusheon Lake would require all the land adjoining the west shore of the Lake. This is presently held under a number of different ownerships and would require a considerable sum to purchase.

The lookout area could be developed as a roadside viewpoint, although the best view is obtained by walking about one hundred yards and climbing one hundred feet to the actual peak. This is not included in present parcel of land but should be, if, at any time in the future a picnic site was established.

In the meantime, a small parking area could be developed as a roadside improvement, but would suggest that Dept. of Highways be asked to include this in any road improvement programme.
